

Subject: Excessive Heat Warning - August 14th 1:00 p.m. (1300 hrs) until August 16th 8:00 p.m.

WEATHER SUMMARY

The National Weather Service issued an Excessive Heat Watch on the night of August 13, 2015. It has been upgraded to an Excessive Heat Warning for August 14th at 1:00 p.m. (1300 hrs) until Sunday, August 16th at 8:00 p.m. (2000 hrs) for the following areas: San Fernando Valley, San Gabriel Valley, lower mountain areas, Santa Monica Mountains, and Ventura County. The San Fernando Valley, specifically Woodland Hills, is currently experiencing temperatures of 104 °F. Temperatures will be increasing tomorrow to 106°F-107°F, with a possible high of 108°F. The lower mountain areas and the inland coast will also be affected. Downtown Los Angeles will experience highs in the lower 90s. Overnight lows in the Valley areas will be in the 70s. The surrounding Inland Area Empire will also be experiencing excessive heat.



Cooling Facilities

City facilities will be utilized as cooling centers to provide the public with relief from the heat. City facilities are always open to the public during regular business hours. During periods of high temperatures, the City may extend the hours of facilities beyond regular business times.
