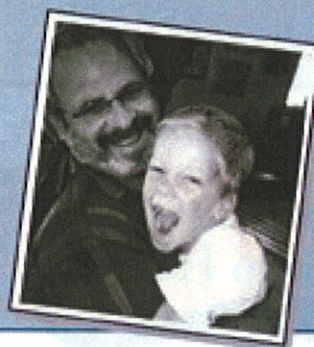
Housing – Apartments
