COVID-19 Prevention

What is known about COVID-19

- Infection with SARS-CoV-2, the virus that causes COVID-19 illness, range of symptoms/severity of illness from asymptomatic, mild symptoms, to severe illness and/or death.
- We don't know how SARS-CoV-2 will affect each person.
- Some people, such as adults 65 and older or people with certain medical conditions, are more likely than others to become severely ill.










How to Prevent COVID-19

















How to Prevent COVID-19

- Wear a mask (or two) that covers your nose and mouth.
- Avoid close contact with others. Stay at least 6 feet (about 2 arm lengths) from other people.
- Avoid crowds and poorly ventilated spaces.
- Wash hands often with soap and water.
- Use an alcohol-based hand sanitizer with at least 60% alcohol, if soap and water are not available.
- Avoid touching your eyes, nose, and mouth with unwashed hands.
- Clean and disinfect frequently touched surfaces daily.
