Health Care Worker- "Family Caregiver"

Caregivers of regional center clients eligible as "**healthcare workers**" for Phase 1A. Eligible family members must obtain documentation from their regional centers, verifying the qualifying condition of the family member cared for and caregiver status.

The client must be at HIGH RISK of COVID-19 complications and related fatalities including the following conditions:

- Cerebral Palsy
- Down Syndrome
- Epilepsy
- Health care needs, including dependence upon ventilators, oxygen, and other technology are eligible.

*Does not include other family members within the same household who do not provide direct care to the regional center client. Can include other family members in the household that do provide direct care.

Health Care Worker "Family Caregiver"

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To Whom It May Concern:

I am submitting this letter from Frank D. Lanterman Regional Center (FDLRC) on behalf of (Client Name) who qualifies for regional center services based on his/her diagnosis of (Cerebral Palsy, Down Syndrome, Epilepsy, or Specialized health care needs). FDLRC provides services to approximately 11,000 individuals with intellectual or developmental disabilities in LA County.

This letter verifies that their parent/family member, (Parent/family member name) is caring for a person(s) with a developmental disability and is a "health care worker" pursuant to the State of California's Vaccination Plan, and thus is prioritized for COVID-19 vaccination within Phase 1A.

A letter from the Director of the State Department of Developmental Services supporting the eligibility of our client's family members accompanies this verification letter.

To Whom It May Concern:

California has a large population of people with intellectual and/or developmental disabilities. Recent COVID-19 studies have identified several groups within this population as being at high risk of COVID-19 complications and related fatalities. The purpose of this letter is to clarify that family members of certain people are "health care workers" pursuant to the State of California's <u>Vaccination Plan</u> (https://covid19.ca.gov/vaccines/#When-can-lget-vaccinated), and thus are prioritized for COVID-19 vaccination within Phase 1A.

These family members include those who care for people with any of the following conditions. This list is not necessarily exhaustive:

- Cerebral palsy
- Down Syndrome
- Epilepsy
- Specialized health care needs, including dependence upon ventilators, oxygen, and other technology

The eligibility of these family members can be ascertained by documentation from their California regional center, verifying the qualifying condition of the member of their household who has an intellectual or developmental disability. A list of regional centers is available here: https://www.dds.ca.gov/rc/listings/. Alternatively, a family member may choose to present medical documentation of the qualifying condition of the member of their household who has an intellectual or developmental disability.

We hope this letter clarifies the eligibility of certain family members for the COVID-19 vaccine pursuant to Phase 1A of the State's Plan, and thereby assists in protecting the health of Californians most at risk from COVID-19 impacts.

People with Medical Conditions and Disabilities Ages 16 to 64 yo (effective 3/15/21)

People with Disabilities and certain Medical Conditions, that are considered HIGH RISK for COVID-19 illness:

- **Cancer**, current with weakened immune system
- Chronic kidney disease, stage 4 or above
- Chronic pulmonary disease, oxygen dependent
- Down syndrome
- Solid organ transplant, leading to a weakened immune system
- Pregnancy
- Sickle cell disease
- Heart conditions, such as heart failure, coronary artery disease, or cardiomyopathies (but not hypertension)
- Severe obesity (Body Mass Index ≥ 40 kg/m²)
- **Type 2 diabetes mellitus** with hemoglobin A1c level greater than 7.5%

People with Medical Conditions and Disabilities Ages 16 to 64 yo (effective 3/15/21)

People who, as a result of a developmental or other significant high-risk disability, meet one or more of the following criteria:

- A COVID-19 infection is likely to result in severe life-threatening illness or death **OR**
- Acquiring COVID-19 will limit the individual's ability to receive ongoing care or services vital to their well-being and survival OR
- Providing adequate and timely COVID care will be particularly challenging as a result of the individual's disability.

* Persons with eligible high-risk conditions or disabilities do not need documentation from a healthcare provider.

Dear Lanterman Family,

We are providing this letter because Governor Newsom has announced that beginning March 15, 2021, individuals between the ages of 16 - 64 with a regional center qualifying diagnosis will be eligible to receive the COVID vaccination.

Please bring the letter printed on the back of this statement to your appointment at the vaccination site. In addition, if you need any assistance with making an appointment to receive the vaccine, please contact your Service Coordinator.

Please note that while we encourage you to seek vaccination, the Regional Center has no jurisdiction over who will receive a vaccine. The Regional Center is following the guidelines provided by the LA County and CA State Dept. of Public Health, and the enclosed letter is being provided only to verify information that may be used to confirm eligibility for the vaccine.

To Vaccinators:

The State's COVID-19 vaccination plan at https://covid19.ca.gov/vaccines establishes vaccination eligibility for certain people, beginning March 15, 2021, including:

"...individuals aged 16-64 who are deemed to be at the very highest risk to get very sick from COVID-19" because they have a specified severe health condition;

OR

"If as a result of their developmental or other severe high-risk disability, ... the individual is likely to develop severe life-threatening illness or death from COVID-19 infection, [or]... will limit the individual's ability to receive ongoing care or services vital to their well-being and survival, [or]... providing adequate or timely COVID care will be particularly challenging as a result of the individual's disability."

This personalized letter certifies that [Nombre del cliente] meets one or more of these criteria, and therefore is eligible for vaccination beginning March 15, 2021, and as vaccine supply is available.

COVID-19 Vaccine Appointments

Where Can I get Vaccinated ?

- Large vaccination sites called PODs (Point of Dispensing Sites) or hubs, Mega Sites (ie: Dodger Stadium, Cal State LA)
- Hospital Medical Groups/ HealthCare Providers (ie: Kaiser, UCLA, Providence)
- Health clinics and Federally Qualified Health Centers (ie: Kedren, Clinica Romero)
- Some workplaces, including hospitals, grocery store chains, school districts
- Some senior housing developments and senior centers
- Skilled nursing facilities (SNFs) and long-term care facilities with congregate living, such as assisted living
- Mobile vaccination units/pop up sites (ie: City of Glendale, City of LA Council Districts)

• **Visit** <u>https://myturn.ca.gov/</u> Click to change the language, Answer the questions to see if you're eligible. If eligible, follow the instructions on the page and answer the questions. If it's not your turn yet, you can sign up to receive updates and to be notified when it is your turn.

COVID-19 vaccination: Find out if it's your turn

Everyone in California will have an opportunity to get vaccinated against COVID-19 at no cost. But our vaccination supply is limited right now. So we're starting with the groups who are at highest risk, like people with a high chance of exposure and people 65 and older.

Are you eligible?

Find out if it's your turn by answering a few questions. It only takes a few minutes. If you're eligible and vaccine appointments are available through My Turn, you can schedule one. If it's not your turn yet or appointments are not available, you can register to be notified when you're eligible or when appointments open up.

NOTICE: Due to the high demand and limited supply of COVID-19 vaccines, appointments may take a few weeks to schedule. We are adding more appointments regularly and continue to expand statewide.

You can register to receive updates about new appointments and locations.

Confirm eligibility

These questions help us confirm your eligibility for COVID-19 vaccines.

- ✓ I certify that I am at least 18 years of age, or the parent or legal guardian of the minor patient.
- I certify that, to the best of my knowledge, the information submitted in this application is true and accurate. I understand that the information I provide here will be used to determine my eligibility for receiving the COVID-19 vaccination and when the vaccine will be made available to me. I give my consent to share my information that I provide here as needed with a licensed healthcare provider administering the vaccine, the California Department of Public Health and its contractors, and local health jurisdictions to provide me with COVID-19 vaccination services.
- I attest to the accuracy of the information provided and understand that falsifying information regarding eligibility could result in the delay of receiving a vaccine.



IMPORTANT NOTE: Some clinics returned for your search result may be outside your county of residence. Your appointment could be cancelled depending on the requirements set in the county you are seeking a vaccine. Each County sets their own geographic requirements and most limit vaccination to those who live or work within the county. So before booking a vaccine appointment outside your County of residence, check the other County's official government website to make sure you are eligible to be vaccinated in that County, otherwise your appointment could be cancelled.

NOTE: Even when you're fully vaccinated, it's still important to get tested if you've been exposed to someone with COVID-19 or have any symptoms. COVID-19 tests work the same for both vaccinated and unvaccinated people.



*Please have your insurance card handy, your address, phone # and details about your vaccine location and appointment ready when you call.

Vaccine Eligibility Documents

Documentation to bring on the day of your appointment:

Proof of eligibility- RC letter, work ID, paycheck stub

Photo ID*- CA ID or Driver's license, passport, gym membership, day program ID (does not need to be a government issued ID)

Proof you live or work in LA County- correspondence, a phone bill, utility bill. Vaccines are free*

Insurance is not required. Regardless of immigration status.

You may be asked to bring your insurance card, this is for reimbursement purposes only, if you have insurance.
