Students are trained to use public transportation while in the community. Students can be travel trained to use public transportation from home to school, work, shopping, etc.



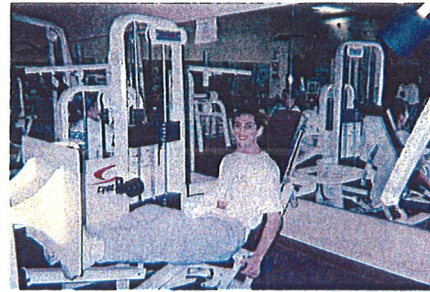
JOB PLACEMENT

INTERAGENCY COLLABORATION

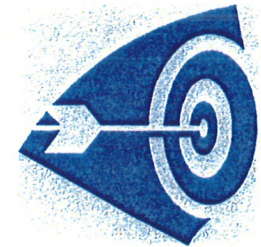
The F.A.C.T.S. program works closely with the Department of Rehabilitation and Regional Center to make the transition.

INTEGRATION

Age appropriate community settings are used to integrate the students so they will be ready for the adult world when they reach 22 years old.

The students are taught safety skills in the community, on the streets, on the bus and on the job.

A Sex Education Curriculum is used to teach the students appropriate social and sexual behavior. Students learn to take responsibility for their actions.



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
