

Realizing Education And Career Hopes (REACH) is Junior Blind's early outreach program for middle and high school students who are blind or low vision, and interested in pursuing careers and/or higher education.



What can REACH do for me?

REACH offers you a running start toward your future by helping you:

- Explore your interests.
- Identify your strengths and where you might need support.
- Navigate through the Individualized Education Program (IEP) process and rehabilitation and Independent Living Skills services.
- Learn what it takes to go to college and/ or have a career.
- Access successful college students, graduates and professionals who are blind or low vision who can share their experiences and guidance.

Who does REACH help?

REACH helps youth, ages 12-20, who are blind or low vision and interested in pursuing careers and/or higher education. Participants must reside in California and possess the academic potential to achieve a high school diploma or equivalent.

Assessment

The **REACH** program begins with a student-centered assessment that includes:

- Functional reading/writing/math skills
- Pre-vocational/vocational skills
- Independent Living Skills
- Cognitive, emotional, social and physical development

Plan/Goals

Results from the assessment help define your **REACH** Transition Plan, including your individual goals and the services you will need to achieve them. **REACH** will help guide you as you evaluate your career, vocational and college options. We will also invite you to career and college workshops and organized recreational activities with other **REACH** participants.


Can my family help?
